


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OUR MISSION

AYEAR IN REVIEW



JANUARY 2019

We started off the year of 2019 with 415 students in our Carol Zulu Primary School-a 59% increase from last year! Every new year brings with it hope for a better future for these kiddos.

JULY 2019

The last team of the year left for Zambiabringing our number of volunteers to 121! Experiencing the difficult reality of life in Zambia while on a team **allows volunteers** to go to a place of vulnerability in a way that will prepare their hearts for real growth and change.



FEBRUARY 2019

Through the help of donors we were able to raise money towards purchacing bicycles for our middle and high school kids as a means of getting to class. We were able to help 4 kids get bikes, this turns their 13 mile commute from a 6 hour walk into a 90

AUGUST 2019

We threw our second annual **DonorPalooza** event in August in order to celebrate the lovely group of donors and supporters that make up our community. 412 people came to hear stories about Zambia and celebrate Mothers Without Borders-we love our community!





MARCH 2019

To prepare for the April Sewing Team, we prepared sewing machines to send to the local Zambian women. The April Sewing Team spent all day working one-on-one helping Zambian women develop their sewing skills and become more self-reliant.

SEPTEMBER 2019

We recevied devastating news from our Zambian staff-mass starvation had hit the area and left women, children, and families unable to eat. There was no time to waste-we reached out to our Mothers Without Borders family asking for help.





APRIL 2019

A group of 60 volunteers associated with Fathers and Kids Camping Middle East came to Zambia and built a new classroom block, installed a solar power system, and even painted murals on several of the existing buildings to spread joy to our kiddos!

OCTOBER 2019

We responded to the hunger crisis through Make a Difference Day. With the help of so many of our loyal supporters we were able to raise a total of \$179,339 for our Zambian friends. We can not thank you enough for your generosity. LOVE WORKS!





MAY 2019

Our U.S. Intern Team of 9 set out to Zambia to experience the orphan crisis and cultural exchange—all while also focusing on the personal growth, humanitarian service, and "Love Works" aspects that come along with traditional teams.

NOVEMBER 2019

Another trial hit Zambia this month in the form of a **bad storm that blew off part of** the roof of the Children's Resource Center. We were able to bounce back quickly as there were no injuries and emergency funds were used to quickly repair the roof.


DECEMBER 2019

As the school year came to a close, we started preparing for growth at the Carol Zulu Primary School for the next year. **Last** year 110 new students and 3 new teachers joined our school!

We Believe that Love Works.

We use an individualized, holistic approach for each child in our care.

Every child has differing physical, emotional, spiritual, and social needs that are only fully met when looked at one by one. The Children's Resource Center (CRC) was created to provide orphaned and vulnerable children with the resources they need to overcome their unique individual circumstances and enter society as caring, productive adults. The CRC is available to children that have been neglected, are living on the streets, or are leading their own households. It gives them an opportunity to be raised in a family setting with caring adults who will mentor and encourage them.

The CRC is a safe-haven for the 49 orphaned children who live onsite. At the CRC, the children help with chores, gardening, cleaning, laundry, and cooking. Volunteers, caregivers, and the children themselves are always improving the property grounds. This includes activities like building rooms, clearing land, painting walls, digging drain-away ditches, sanding the water tower, spreading gravel, and planting flowers. The property has evolved into a beautiful area that the children call home. This year we have employed 45 Zambian people. Employment enables these workers to provide income, opportunity, and a spirit of love to their own families.

We believe education has the power to transform generations.

After the Children's Resource Center was built, we started a small school to educate our children and those in the surrounding village. Our school, the Carol Zulu Primary School, has come a long way since it began with 25 students in a chicken-coop classroom. This year we added another block of 4 classrooms which has increased our enrollment to 525 students! Though our school is made up of vulnerable students who come from very difficult circumstances, our teachers work very hard to ensure the education provided to them is the best in Zambia. Our school is equipped with curriculum designed to assist students' rapid advancement.

We Aim to Empower.

We believe that people can lift themselves out of poverty when provided the right opportunities to develop self-reliance.

Our 17 to Self-Reliance Program is changing the lives of young adults in Zambia. We aid 62 adolescents in preparing a bright future for themselves through scholarships, education supplies, bicycles, and clothing to help them travel to school and excel in their studies. These students are ambitious and hardworking in finishing their high school education. Many have also prepared to receive a college education. We even had a group of girls enter nursing school this year! The future is bright for these students and we are so excited to see the success they achieve!




A Girl's Dream Project—Stay in School

This year the Zambian government invited us to bring our women's empowerment and 17 to Self-Reliance programs to other areas in Lusaka. In 2019, we started our initial response with 10 girls. We started working with young adult girls and their families to keep them in school instead of being married off at a young age, which is a common practice in the area. We love our Zambian girls and are excited about the opportunities and safety that this initiative will provide for them!
